- This two-phase redevelopment project at Salisbury District Hospital focused on enhancing maternity services through the creation of a new day assessment unit, a dedicated birthing centre, and a centralised reception area serving all maternity departments
- The works were delivered in a live hospital environment, with the aim of improving care for expectant mothers in both high-risk and low-risk settings
- Ongoing coordination with hospital administrators ensured alignment on programme and reduced disruption to operations
- Open communication and responsive planning enabled a smooth delivery in this high-traffic, sensitive environment
- Key challenges included managing construction next to the hospital's busy ambulance bay and maintaining safe access for staff, patients, and emergency vehicles. These were addressed through detailed logistics planning, timed deliveries, and robust safety measures such as pedestrian diversions and noise/dust control
- The completed facilities now provide modern, patient-focused spaces that support improved clinical care and enhance the overall experience for mothers and families
- The project demonstrates how healthcare upgrades can be successfully delivered in operational settings without compromising safety, access, or service continuity
